
#### **Emergency CAFOD appeal TODAY**

I invite the whole Church to rediscover, to safeguard, and to live the truth and power of the Christian celebration.

#### Liturgy and Worship

is one of the four priorities singled out in Archbishop Bernard's Pastoral Vision to inform and guide the work of preparing more solid foundations for the Church in Birmingham in coming decades.

It is also the focus of the **Prayer** and **Liturgy**Directory recently issued for Catholic Schools, Academies and
Colleges in England and Wales.

#### The Way of Communion

offers a new opportunity for guided learning about Liturgy, Worship, Prayer. It makes use of two recent publications coming from our Bishops' Conference—the Prayer and Liturgy Directory and Catholic Liturgy, a study guide written by pastoral and academic liturgists that covers the history, content and debates around the use of Liturgy in the Catholic Church. Each was written with a broad and non-specialist readership in mind.

The course runs from May to December (with August off!) with a on-line meeting from 7.30 – 8.30pm on the first two Mondays of each month – with those who wish welcome to stay on beyond the hour to continue and broaden the conversation, with nothing off limits!

The course is FREE. Participants will only need access to Zoom, and their own copies of Catholic Liturgy and the Prayer and Liturgy Directory — and are asked to read the relevant chapter/sectons in advance of each on-line meeting.







#### The Way of Communion

has been prepared for members of the parishes, schools and communities of 'Catholic Sutton Coldfield' but is open to all members of the Archdiocese of Birmingham.

## Living and sharing in Communion





One way in which their connection with the Church can remain real and vital is when more able members of the parish can bring spiritual support to those presently housebound. We surely do this for those for those we know personally. But there are many who are in our community who are relatively 'anonymous' Catholics. If we are to offer support to all of those who seek it we need to organise some things centrally too.

Probably high on that list is support in prayer and the opportunity to receive Holy Communion regularly.

The hope is that our parish can offer to all who are housebound the opportunity to receive this care and support weekly (fortnightly from Fr Allen, and fortnightly from a lay minister). But to do this we need more ministers willing to offer half an hour or so twice a month to support to complement what Fr Allen can do.

After each Mass this weekend there will be a 20 minute meeting n the Benedict Room for anyone who is interested in learning what would be involved in helping take part in this parish support of some of our 'less visible' members.

## The Liturgy of the Word Acts 9:26-31

When Saul got to Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him: they could not believe he was really a disciple. Barnabas, however, took charge of him, introduced him to the apostles, and explained how the Lord had appeared to Saul and spoken to him on his journey, and how he had preached boldly at Damascus in the name of Jesus. Saul now started to go round with them in Jerusalem, preaching fearlessly in the name of the Lord. But after he had spoken to the Hellenists, and argued with them, they became determined to kill him. When the brothers knew, they took him to Caesarea, and sent him off from there to Tarsus.

The churches throughout Judaea, Galilee and Samaria were now left in peace, building themselves up, living in the fear of the Lord, and filled with the consolation of the Holy Spirit.

#### Psalm 21(22):26-28,30-32



My vows I will pay before those who fear him. The poor shall eat and shall have their fill. They shall praise the Lord, those who seek him. May their hearts live for ever and ever!

All the earth shall remember and return to the Lord, all families of the nations worship before him; They shall worship him, all the mighty of the earth; before him shall bow all who go down to the dust.

And my soul shall live for him, my children serve him. They shall tell of the Lord to generations yet to come, declare his faithfulness to peoples yet unborn: 'These things the Lord has done.'

#### 1 John 3:18-24

My children, our love is not to be just words or mere talk, but something real and active; only by this can we be certain that we are children of the truth and be able to quieten our conscience in his presence, whatever accusations it may raise against us, because God is greater than our conscience and he knows everything. My dear people, if we cannot be condemned by our own conscience, we need not be afraid in God's presence, and whatever we ask him, we shall receive, because we keep his commandments and live the kind of life that he wants. His commandments are these: that we believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and that we love one another as he told us to.

Whoever keeps his commandments lives in God and God lives in him. We know that he lives in us by the Spirit that he has given us.

#### **Gospel Acclamation**

Alleluia, alleluia! Make your home in me, as I make mine in you. Whoever remains in me bears fruit in plenty. Alleluia!

#### John 15:1-8

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in me that bears no fruit he cuts away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes to make it bear even more.

You are pruned already, by means of the word that I have spoken to you. Make your home in me, as I make mine in you. As a branch cannot bear fruit all by itself, but must remain part of the vine, neither can you unless you remain in me.

I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me, with me in him, bears fruit in plenty; for cut off from me you can do nothing.

Anyone who does not remain in me is like a branch

that has been thrown away – he withers; these **The mystery of faith** branches are collected and thrown on the fire, and they are burnt.

If you remain in me and my words remain in you, you may ask what you will and you shall get it. It is to the glory of my Father that you should bear much fruit, and then you will be my disciples.'
